some abstract way, but to do so by imitating Christ specifically in his sacrificial gift of self. It is a call to pour ourselves out as an offering to God, just as Jesus did on the Cross. Embracing this "loss of all things," Paul tells us, is the only way to "gain Christ and be found in him" (Philippians 3:8-9). (Run time 28:32).

Stewardship Reflection: 6th Sunday in Ordinary Time

1st Reading: Jeremiah 17.5-8 2nd Reading: 1 Cor. 15.12, 16-20 Gospel: Luke 6.17, 20-26 – *Blessings and Woes*

Summary

Being a steward involves the total gift of our time and talents to our parish community for the good of the Church. However, despite all our good deeds, we may at times be discouraged when the fruits of our labour are not visible. Let us trust that God is silently doing great things through the gift of ourselves and strive to work ever more ardently.
