Canada Summer Jobs Program Be Informed & Reach Out to Your MP

The federal government has introduced new requirements for employers applying for the Canada Summer Jobs grant. To be eligible for funding, employers must attest that both the job and the organization's core mandate respect certain "values" as determined by the federal government including the government's position on abortion, sexual orientation and gender identity or expression. Organizations unable or unwilling to make this attestation in whole or in part will be deemed ineligible for the grant. This requirement is clearly unjust.

Many Catholic organizations throughout the Archdiocese of Toronto and many other faiths involved in charitable activity at soup kitchens, shelters, refugee welcome centres or summer camps are impacted by this decision. June Is Seniors' Month

June is designated as Seniors' Month. Seniors constitute a new generation in need of ongoing faith development and support through all the challenges and opportunities that mark the second half of life. Our Church needs to do more for maturing adults (50+) and we need your help. 29 June is the day set apart in the Catholic world for the celebration of the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul. Apart from Mary, the mother of Jesus, St Joseph and St John the Baptist, these are the only human figures commemorated in the calendar of the universal Church with a day given the rank of 'Solemnity'. Like all saints, Peter and Paul did not come with sanctity ready-made from heaven. We respect them because in them the grace of God achieved its purpose. Such grace works in different ways. Sometimes God's grace, like the prophet Jeremiah, has to 'destroy and overthrow, to build and to plant' (Jeremiah 1:10). Paul and Peter offer us instances of each of these dynamics.

In Paul's case, God's grace had 'to destroy and overthrow'. Paul boasted how 'as to the law he was a Pharisee as to righteousness under the law blameless', but, Whatever gains I had, these I have come to regard as loss because of the surpassing value of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have suffered the loss of all things' (Philippians 3:4-7). When Paul prayed to be freed from 'the thorn in the flesh', a messenger of Satan sent to torment him, the Lord replied, 'My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness' (2 Corinthians 12:10). As to boasting, he wrote, 'If I must boast, I will boast of the things that show my weakness' (2 Corinthians 11:30). Luke in Acts gives a dramatic instance of this grace of God at work. His account of Paul's conversion begins with Paul 'breathing threats and murder against the disciples of the Lord', but it concludes by describing how Paul, having met the light of Christ, had to be led by the hand and brought into Damascus

As for Peter, his was a situation in which God's grace had 'to build up and plant'. Gospel incidents provide examples of such grace in action. When Peter sank below the waves after walking on the water, Jesus 'immediately reached out his hand and caught him saying, "You of little faith, why did you doubt?"' (Matthew 14:31). At the last supper the Lord said to Peter, 'Simon, Simon, listen! Satan has demanded to sift all of you like wheat, but I have prayed for you that your faith may not fail' (Luke 22:31-32). And when Peter had denied his Lord three times, Luke tells us how 'The Lord turned and looked at Peter'. He then went out and wept bitterly (Luke 22:61-62).

Peter and Paul represent two strikingly different approaches to discipleship. Peter had to learn slowly, make many mistakes along the way, but always experienced the compassionate forgiveness and encouragement of Jesus. Paul, on the other hand, came to the Faith immediately and never backed away from his zeal for Christ after that. Many of us can see both these great Apostles in ourselves. Like Peter, we sometimes fail but yet persevere. Like Paul, we must always be on fire for the Lord, and proclaim Him to everyone and in every situation, no matter how difficult it can sometimes be to do so.
