#### Ministry Recognition Weekend

As part of our parish commitment to stewardship, we will recognize one of our parish ministries on the first Sunday of each month. We want to acknowledge the commitment to service that people in our parish share with us in such a variety of ways. Each month, we will highlight a ministry with a bulletin announcement, a brief description of the work of the ministry and a blessing/commissioning for the people involved.

Each of us has been blessed with gifts from God, and we will celebrate the way that so many in our parish share those gifts with us. This will also provide an opportunity for each ministry to invite fellow parishioners to ask how they can become more involved in our parish life.

In the New Year, on the first weekend in January 2020 we take a moment to appreciate the efforts of our Sacramental Preparation Teams and recognize their committed service to the parish of Corpus Christi.

Preparing people to receive sacraments is a timehonoured practice of the Church. Faith formation is a lifelong process. Sacraments are milestones – signposts – along this faith journey. They are like road signs that guide us on the way to holiness, continually point us towards Christ, and ultimately lead us to our final destination which is heaven. We encounter Jesus through the Sacraments of Initiation—Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist.

We have three Sacramental Preparation Teams in our parish, Baptism: Frank O'Neill, First Reconciliation and First Communion: Andrea Sisca, Christy Cousineau and Lourdes DaCosta, Confirmation Benjamin Turland and Sara Andino. We conduct Baptism Preparations on the first weekend of each month and we invite new parents to attend this preparatory session to equip themselves in forming their children in the light of faith. First Reconciliation and First Communion and Confirmation preparation starts in the fall with the parents meeting and we hold eight to ten sessions for the children and parents are involved in few sessions. The members of these teams are so committed to the faith formation of our children and young families.
