



THE FEAST OF CORPUS CHRISTI

Feast of Corpus Christ, honours of the real presence of the body of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist and by extension we become the body of Christ. The Prayer of St. Teresa of Avila highlights the fact that we are the body of Christ.

"Christ has no body on earth but yours.

Yours are the eyes with which he looks compassionately on this world.

Yours are the feet with which he walks to do good. Yours are the hands with which he blesses all the world. Christ has no body now on earth but yours!"

The body of Christ is suffering. The racist events in the U.S have highlighted the inequality, the fear and the systemic racism that is prevalent. If we feel a sense of relief that this is happening in the U.S. and not in Canada we need to think again. There have been Anti-Muslim, anti-Semitic terrorist attacks; missing and murdered Indigenous women and girls; systemic racism that was part of the residential schools; and disproportionate death of people of colour.

Pope Francis in his address on June 3 attributed "the tragic death of George Floyd to the sin of racism" stating that "we cannot tolerate or turn a blind eye to racism and exclusion in any form and yet to claim to defend the sacredness of every human life."

Cardinal Collins in his June 5 statement on racism writes: "It is important that we authentically listen to the plight of those who have been victims of racism, intolerance and violence. While we enjoy one of the most ethically diverse faith communities in North America, we must continue to remind ourselves daily to follow the example of Jesus to love one another as ourselves without exception. Racism knows no boundaries and it remains a present day challenge that must not be ignored. We join together in prayer for victims of racism, violence and intolerance and for those who are working peacefully to effect change. May each of us reflect the loving face of Jesus to all those whom we encounter on the journey.

At Pentecost, we are given the gift of the Holy Spirit. Trinity Sunday gives us a model of the Trinity as a communion of love and right relationship. At the Feast of Corpus Christi may we have the courage and passion to become the Body of Christ here on earth – to be God's eyes, feet, hands and above all God's heart to confront the root causes of racism and the injustice it produces
