now received the good news that His Eminence Cardinal Collins will be able to preside over a special Mass with us on the feast next year, which will be celebrated on *Sunday*, *June* 6th, 2021. We sincerely hope and pray that this will give us the chance to gather and mark this important milestone, a little late but no less enthusiastically, as a parish community.

Letter from our Regional Bishop Most Rev. Robert Kasun CSB

Dear Parishioners of Corpus Christi Parish,

I wish to thank Fr. Prasanth George CMI for the impressive work he has done at Corpus Christi Parish. Fr. Prasanth was transferred to Corpus Christi to help address a serious crisis in your parish. He worked hard, with parishioners, to bring about a transformation in the parish community. His work, and your work, has been, and continues to be, effective in the transformative process. I thank Fr. Prasanth and all who have been dedicated to the renewal. With the leadership that Fr. Prasanth has offered you, perhaps most visibly in the development of Stewardship Spirituality at Corpus Christi, but in other respects as well, I trust you as a parish community will be able to continue that good work of ongoing renewal and I thank you for it.

Fr. Prasanth is being transferred to Orillia, much to the sadness and disappointment of parishioners, for the same reason that he was brought to Corpus Christi: to work with parishioners in addressing a serious problem in the Orillia cluster of four parishes and one mission. May all of us pray for him and support him as he undertakes new and heavy responsibilities.

It is not usual to transfer priests in mid-year, as in January. You can imagine the pressing issues which would precipitate such an action. The transfer decision was not made lightly. The Priests' Personnel Department, Cardinal Collins and all the Auxiliary Bishops saw in Fr. George the ability to address these challenging pastoral issues in a competent way.

I apologize for the short notice of the transfer. The announcement needs to be made in both parishes at the same time. If it isn't, serious and harmful gossip can result. It was not wise or prudent for the "other" pastor to announce his transfer at an earlier time.

Although not all parishioners will accept the thought process that led to the decision, I believe that "transparency," wherever possible and prudent, is an important way for bishops to respect and honour the people of God.


Advent Confession

<u>Fourth Sunday of Advent</u> Pondering the Incarnation with your children:



The Scripture passages read during the Advent and Christmas liturgies allow us all to ponder truths which captivate elementary-aged children. Take a few moments to reflect with your child on what they have heard.

The Gospel for the Fourth Sunday of Advent comes from Luke 1:26-

38. What do you hear about Jesus when you listen to what the angel announced to Mary? What do you discover about Mary? Does learning about one help you to learn about the other? What prophecies to you hear being fulfilled? Mary was asked by God to help Him and she said, "Yes!" with her whole heart. In what way might He be asking you to help Him today? What will your response be? – CGS USA

There are four different Gospel passages you might hear at the Christmas liturgy; one that we also hear in the Atrium comes from Luke 2. Reading this Scripture can help us to prepare to celebrate the first moment when the long-awaited Great Light was finally able to be seen with human eyes and held with human arms. Let us glorify and praise God for such a great gift! What might this tell us about the moment when we, too, will see God "face to face" (1 Corinthians 13:12). – CGS USA

May this light, from our Lord, fill our hearts with his peace, joy and love. Jesus' light will shine and we will know that our God is always constant, unwavering and faithful. May the baby, born in Bethlehem, bless you and your loved ones.
